Bylaws, Article II – Purposes and Objectives

Section 1: The purposes and objectives of the Council shall be exclusively charitable and educational within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as the same may be amended from time to time.

Section 2: It is the intention of the Council to qualify, and remain qualified, as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the United State Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as the same may be amended from time to time.

Section 3: The purposes and objectives of the Council shall be as follows:

A. to serve as advocates for the needs of the Jewish community, particularly within the Council's local geographic area, which shall include, but shall not be limited to, the towns of Brookhaven, East Hampton, Riverhead, Shelter Island, Southampton and Southold;

B. to support and further efforts to promote Jewish identity and continuity;

C. to support and strengthen opportunities for lay leadership and Council rabbis to meet and work to address local Jewish and community needs and issues as determined by the Council;

D. to encourage mutual understanding and respect among people of all faiths and beliefs;

E. to combat anti-Semitism and all forms of prejudice and discrimination, particularly within the Council's local geographic area;

F. to enrich Jewish cultural and religious experience;

G. to improve the communal, cultural, educational, religious, and social welfare of all people, particularly within the Council's local geographic area;

H. to explain Jewish culture and practices to all people;

I. to work with member synagogues to promote the functions, programs and activities of said members and to encourage membership in said synagogues.
